COMMUNITY SUPPORT - SPECIAL PROGRAMS AFFECTING POSITIVE CIVIC & COMMUNITY CHANGE

Committees are the working force of the Chamber. Their purpose is to achieve the Chamber's goals-- to carry out the program of work of the chamber to bring about community betterment and improvement. While some committees are open to volunteerism and recruitment by the Committee Chairperson, there are some that require a Chamber invitation to serve; please call the Chamber office to enquire further.

- Ambassadors A group of members that support and promote the chamber. This is a committee that plans networking events, as well as coordinate and participate in monthly networking events, open houses, ribbon cuttings and our annual Business Expo.
- **BEPN [Business Emergency Preparedness Network]** The BEPN is a volunteer committee of business people in Santa Fe Springs and is designed to prepare businesses to respond in emergency situations. The network provides training, organizational guidance, and helps businesses develop their own formal emergency plans. This program is run in conjunction with the Santa Fe Springs Chamber of Commerce and the City of Santa Fe Springs. Information on current BEPN activities are scheduled periodically.
- Business Expo This committee plans and organizes the Annual Business Expo which is held in September at Heritage Park. The event usually attracts over 300 business associates and local residents and showcases around 60 vendor booths
- CHOICES Program This is an opportunity to present a program geared around making smart
 choices to students at Santa Fe High School, St. Paul High School and Pioneer High School.
 Furthermore, through role playing, students get a first-hand look at the impact that both
 positive and negative decisions have on their future.
- Citizenship Award This committee selects two recipients annually for this award; one from the business/professional community and the other representing the residential community.
 Committee is active August through December. Limited Membership.
- **Destiny Dinner** The culmination of a year-long and concerted effort by the Youth Enrichment Fund (YEF), this event is the single largest fundraising event for the Powell Grant and Destiny Scholarships. These awards are given at this event to students from Santa Fe Spring continuing their educational pursuit in higher education.
- Economic Development Forum This program is a joint Chamber-City coordination designed to
 attract new businesses to the city of Santa Fe Springs as well as communicate current trends and
 influences at work within the local economic environment. Forums are scheduled throughout
 the year.
- **Future Business Leaders** A program designed with the future leaders of tomorrow in mind, business community leaders have a chance to hear from and work with students to ensure that they are a more informed and better prepared workforce of tomorrow.
- **Golf Committee** This committee organizes the Annual Golf Classic, which is held in the spring. The committee meets in the winter/spring as needed and is responsible for the planning, coordinating and fundraising component of the yearly event.
- **HR Forum** This is a monthly forum that addresses the many challenges that HR professionals face on a daily basis. With topics ranging from wage and hour & social media in the workplace to sexual harassment & policy and procedures, Paul Fleck [HR Attorney with Atkinson, Andelson, Loya, Ruud & Romo] delivers timely and relevant information on a myriad of topics.

- **Leads Group(s)** Members who meet regularly that are committed to developing stronger relationships and dedicated to providing meaningful referrals to one another.
- Mentor Program Partnered with Santa Fe High School's Business Academy, representatives from the business community are paired up with juniors in the Academy and attend cultural, social, educational and developmental events with their mentees. The 9-month commitment is an opportunity for the students to learn from their mentees and utilize their leadership as they progress through high school and beyond.
- Non-Profit Forum This is a committee that brings together non-profit professionals in an effort to pool resources, share best practices and identify any needs and pain points the organizations face. It is also an opportunity to learn about each other's agenda, in hopes to forge partnership opportunities and maximize the reach of the chamber.
- RCA Legislative Forum This is a regional coalition of chambers which meets to discuss
 legislative issues at the State and Federal level which can potentially impact business. The
 following chambers currently participate on this committee: Norwalk, Pico Rivera, Santa Fe
 Springs, and Whittier. Representing the business community, committee members visit our
 state capitol annually.
- Safety & Security Committee this is seminar oriented committee which presents on topics and issues that affect the safety and security of businesses. This is another opportunity that is open to all chamber members.
- **Women In Business** Various programs and events held periodically geared to the personal and professional development of women. This committee traditionally meets once monthly.
- Youth Education Committee The purpose of this committee is to coordinate partnerships between the business and educational communities of Santa Fe Springs, in order to enhance the educational programs. Committee meets first Thursday of the month.
